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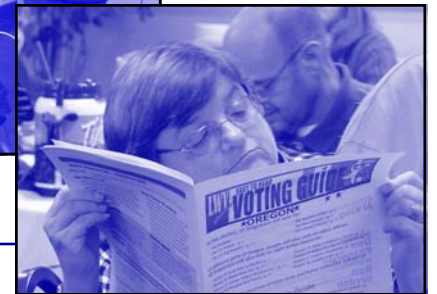

Activities

Assist protection and advocacy systems (PandAs) to identify and address barriers to cognitive accessibility.

Conduct on-site Project Vote trainings with state PandAs to provide cognitive accessible voter education.

Provide technical assistance to PandAs through an interactive website (www.govoter.org), conference calls, email and telephone support.

Connect PandAs with self-advocacy groups.

Develop tools and materials for increasing cognitive access, including guides, videos, and training materials.
